
NOVEMBER 2018

FESTIVAL 2018

During this year our team of 24 adjudicators travelled the length and breadth of KZN to adjudicate 105 festivals. These were held at schools in Matatiele, Eshowe, Gingindlovu, Estcourt, Harding, Howick, Newcastle, Winterton, Underberg and Mooi River as well as in Durban, Pietermaritzburg, and up and down the North and South Coasts.

Thank you to all involved in the successful organisation of the festivals, and to the school principals who encourage teachers and pupils to participate.

Unreliable postal deliveries led to a number of schools not receiving stationery on time (or at all)! If you have not yet received your festival certificates please contact the office immediately as all certificates have been posted.

Bursaries have been finalised and these, together with certificates, have also been posted to the relevent schools. The names of all the bursary recipients will appear in the first issue of *The Platform* in 2019.

75TH BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION


12 SEPTEMBER 2018

An audience of 300, made up of parents, teachers, adjudicators and special guests, attended the Showcase Evening at the Elizabeth Sneddon Theatre where they were treated to performances by 133 pupils from nine schools, as well as performances by local artists, Marion Loudon, Iain 'Ewok' Robinson and Rowin Munsamy.

The evening opened with a lively Choral Verse performed by the Grade 4 pupils from North Crest Primary School in Redhill. This was followed by a warm welcome from the Chairman of the Association, Dr Mervyn McMurtry, who gave an interesting account of the beginnings and growth of the Speech and Drama Association since it's founding in 1943 by Elizabeth Sneddon. Presentations of poetry from the earliest syllabi were presented by members of the Executive Committee.

Further items of Choral Verse, as well as Poetry, a Mime, a Monologue, Story Telling and Dramatic Movement, all categories from the syllabus, were presented by pupils from Crawford Prep School La Lucia, DPHS, Ethembeni School, Highbury Prep School, Port Natal Hoerskool, Sherwood Primary School, St Mary's DSG and Tree Tops Primary School.

2019 FEES AND BOOKINGS

Schools will be contacted by email at the beginning of 2019. Please complete the Membership Form that is sent to, you as soon as possible, so that any changes in school staff or contact details can be updated on our system.

The 2019 Membership Fee has been increased from R425 to R450. There is, however, no increase in Entry Fees. Individual items remain at R30 per item, group items at R75 per group, and group items with less than 3 candidates still costing R25 per candidate.

Workshops are a great help in preparing for the festival and each school workshop is structured to suit a particular school's needs. The workshop is held at your school at a date and time that suits you. The cost of a workshop for approximately 20 teachers is R600 per hour. If you would like to have a workshop for your staff or pupils, contact the office to book before your 2019 festival.

WHO ARE THEY?

ELIZABETH SNEDDON founded the Speech and Drama Association in 1943 and started the annual festival which is held in schools to this day.

JILIAN HURST was Senior Lecturer in the Department of Speech and Drama at Natal University (now UKZN) until her retirement in1997.

HAZEL MEYER was secretary of the Speech and Drama Association for over 20 years. When she retired in 1990, she offered her services as an adjudicator and particularly enjoyed adjudicating very young children. The Hazel Meyer Bursary is usually awarded to a Junior Primary school pupil.
